

HOW TO GUIDE: Country Kitchens Bunting

The following 'How to guide' can be used to make fruit and vegetable themed bunting for your Showcase. This bunting looks great when it is put on display at any Country Kitchens event.

Step 1: Gather up your resources

You will need:

- Material (your choice – patterns, bright colours, prints with fruit and vegetables)
- Bunting tea towel (optional) - if you would like to include Country Kitchens branding these be ordered using the resource order form. The Bunting tea towel comes with 3m of bunting tape for \$10.00
- Scissors
- Sewing machine
- Thread
- Bunting tape
- Tape measures
- Fabric Marker
- Pins
- Iron and board

Step 2: Make the bunting

1. Draw a triangle on some paper and cut out to use as a bunting template. It is your choice on how big you want to make the triangles, we suggest 20x20x15cm. Pin to your fabric and cut 20 pieces (this will make a row of 10 bunting). We would love you to use the Country Kitchens branded bunting- it is up to you how you wish to do this, you could cut out the coloured triangles and stitch them on with a zig-zag stitch or make the tea towel into triangles to alternate with your other fabric (see image).
2. Lay two triangle shapes together with the printed sides facing together and sew along each side of the triangle, leaving the top open—Snip off the tip and any stray threads.
3. Turn the triangles inside out (and push out the point with the tip of the scissors).
4. Iron flat on both sides.
5. Fold your bunting tape in half and pin your triangles onto the tape so that they sit inside the fold. Space the triangles equally apart. Then simply sew along the edge of the tape close to the fold to secure all the triangles in place.
